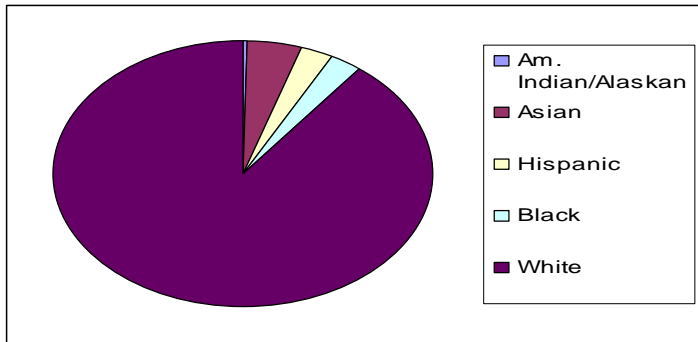
#### Literacy Vision

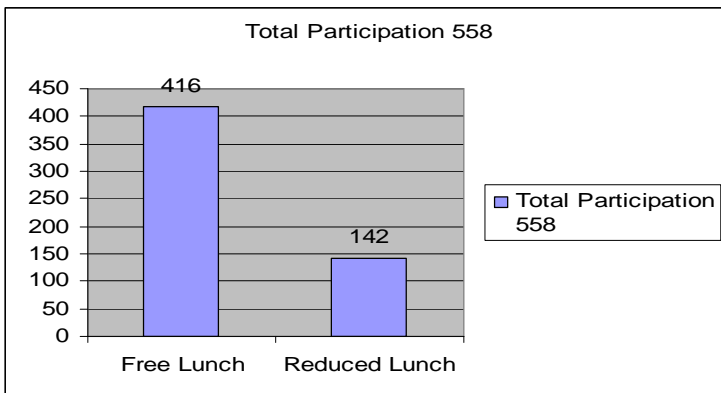

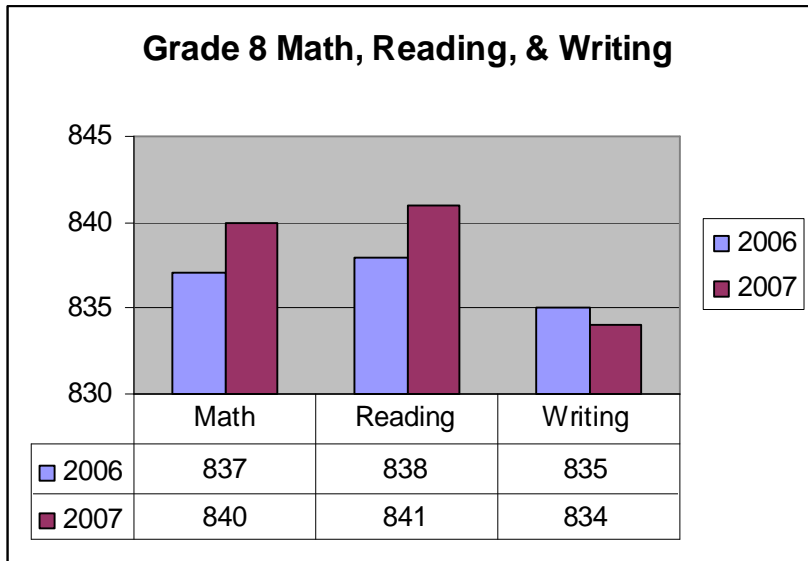

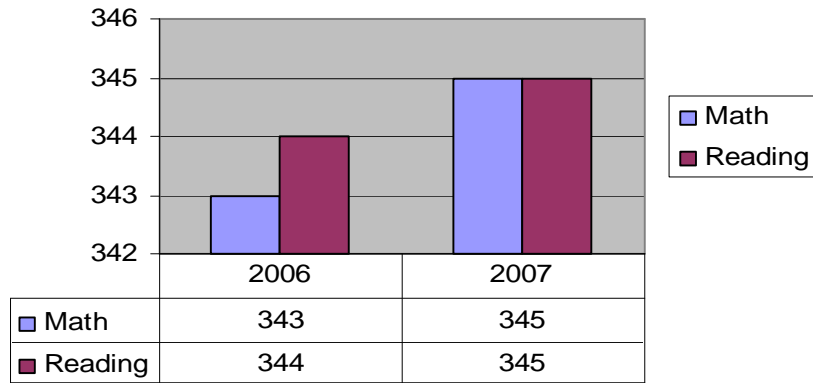
**Annual Yearly Progress**

Currently SAU 56 has three schools in need of improvement; all in the area of Literacy.

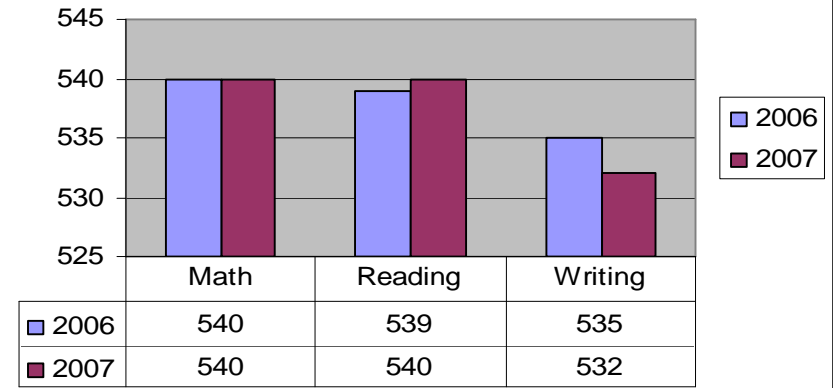

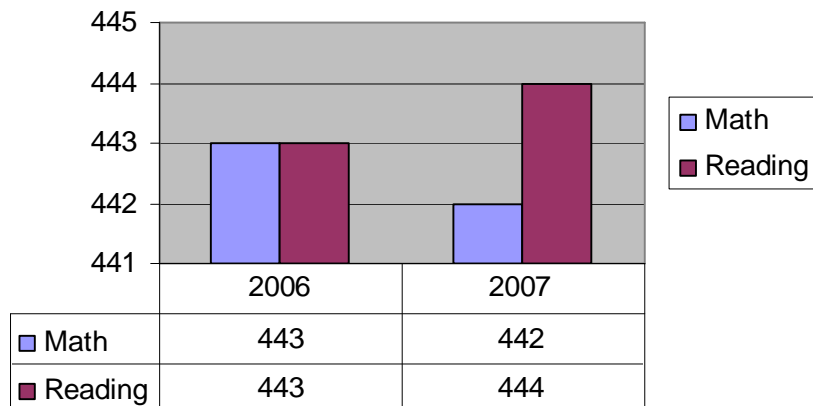
### Grade 3 Math & Reading
