

## Rollinsford.....SAU56 Withdrawal Process/Timeline

- November 2018
  - Somersworth initiates Somersworth withdrawal from SAU56
- December 2018
  - Somersworth City Council and School Board form Community Withdrawal Committee
  - Rollinsford School Board creates Warrant for voters to approve Rollinsford Community Withdrawal Committee
- January 2019
  - Somersworth Withdrawal Committee already at work defining what is best for Somersworth in the SAU56 breakup, and will need to also define what could work for Rollinsford
- March 2019
  - Rollinsford voters approve the Warrant allowing Rollinsford to define what is best for Rollinsford in the SAU56 breakup, Rollinsford will also need to define what could work for Somersworth
  - Rollinsford School Board forms Community Withdrawal Committee, subject to RSA 194-C
- April – November 2019
  - Both Somersworth and Rollinsford Withdrawal Committees work to define what will work best for their own communities, as well as what could work for the other community
  - Somersworth holds public meetings in both Somersworth and Rollinsford to review and hear comment on Somersworth's plan for both communities
    - Present Somersworth Withdrawal Plan to NH Department of Education
  - Rollinsford holds public meetings in both Rollinsford and Somersworth to review and hear comment on Rollinsford's plan for both communities
    - Present Rollinsford Withdrawal Plan to NH Department of Education
  - Rollinsford School Board encourages both withdrawal committees to collaborate where possible to ensure the best plan for both communities
- January 2019 / February 2020
  - Assuming NH Department of Education and Rollinsford School Board/community withdrawal committee have an agreed upon solution:
    - Rollinsford school Board places a Warrant outlining the withdrawal plan on the ballot for voter approval
- March 2020
  - Rollinsford voters to approve proposed changes to how Rollinsford School District is supervised to be effective July 1, 2020
